The Waste (Scotland) Regulations 2012

The Scottish Ministers make the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972(a) and all other powers enabling them to do

In accordance with paragraph 2(2) of Schedule 2 to that Act(b), a draft of these Regulations has been laid before and approved by resolution of the Scottish Parliament.

Citation, commencement and extent

1.--(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Waste (Scotland) Regulations 2012, and come into force on the day after the day on which they are made. (2) These Regulations extend to Scotland only

Amendment of the Environmental Protection Act 1990

2.-(1) The Environmental Protection Act 1990(c) is amended as follows

(2) In section 29(5A) (preliminary)(d), after paragraph (b) insert-

"(ba) "separate collection" means that waste is presented for collection, and collected, in a manner that ensures that-

(i) dry recyclable waste is kept separate from other waste;

Waste (Scotland) Regulations 2012

- **Specific Measures:-** \bullet
 - Businesses to present dry recyclables (metals, plastics, paper, card and glass) and food waste of >50kg/week by 1st Jan 2014. Those producing <50kg exempt until 1st Jan 2016.
 - Local authorities to provide householders with a collection for dry recyclables (1st Jan 2014) and food waste (1st Jan 2016)
 - Ban on materials collected for recycling going to landfill or incineration.
 - 1st Jan 2016 ban comes into force to prevent food waste going to drain or sewer.

Separate food waste round

- •Smaller capacity vehicles (larger vehicles only partially filled)
- •Optimum crew size: Driver plus 1 loader
- Mixed use of slave bins and manual loading
- Lower capital costs and running costs
- •Satellite transfer (vehicle to vehicle or vehicle to bulk skip)
- •Easier to replace/cover in breakdown

ZERO WASTE SCOTLAND

Co-collection

- Collect in pod with core material in rear
- Reduced core capacity
- Additional loading times
- Additional crew size
- Co-location of tip needed
- Need to design unload bays
