- To ensure the provision of a hot, healthy and nutritionally balanced meal within schools and day nurseries, contributing towards making children and young people, physically and mentally healthy, prepared and able to learn, and **Be Healthy**.
- Promote Health and Well-Being.
- Reduce Obesity Levels.

Objectives

- Implement Food Standards across all schools.
- Nutritionally analyse menus and adjust recipes, to ensure all children are offered a well balanced meal. This is enabled by 'Saffron' a computerised system which callibrates the recommended levels of nutrients; fat, salt, sugar, calories etc
