
- 25-30% of all Gypsy and Traveller caravans have NO authorised pitch = over 4000 caravans
- Rising numbers of caravans
- · No transit facility in the West Midlands
- Significant tensions between communities
- Last "legitimate" object for discrimination?

Examples of Discrimination

If I had unfettered use of police resources, I would turn up and stop-check all Gypsies and Irish Travellers. They would never give their real names so you could arrest them. Nearly all of them are untaxed or uninsured, and they are fairly heavy drinkers. They run businesses without authorisation. Local people would support that approach, however many resources were used. **Parish councillor**

If they want a place to stay they should buy a house. If they say they can't afford it, then they are no different from anyone else – it applies to everyone. **Parish councillor**



Terminology

- Unauthorised Developments Permanent residential sites (with infrastructure) without planning permission, on land owned by Gypsy & Travellers
- Unauthorised Encampments Transient settlements on a third party's land.

What were the issues

- Significant increase in unauthorised encampments during 2006
- Migration between sites over a concentrated period
- Significant community tensions
- Court capacity in summer 2006
- No alternative transit facility provision in the region
- Desire for permanent residential facilities
