- July 2006 9 Taskforce Sub Group Reports
- May 2007 New Minister for Local Government
- July 2007 Executive agree Review of Local Government aspects of RPA (3 Strands):
 - ✓ Developing shared vision for Local Government
 - ✓ Number of Councils
 - ✓ Transfer of functions

Update on Review Progress



- Review overseen by Sub Committee of Executive, chaired by DOE Minister
- Oct 2007 Emerging Findings of Review to Executive
- Oct/Nov 2007 Stakeholder events
- Jan 2008 Final Report to Executive for decision

Update on Review Progress



Role of SLB

- Agree a joint overall vision for Local Government
- Be the pinnacle of and driver for modernisation and RPA implementation programme
- Agree the remit, functions, priorities and composition of SLB Sub Groups
- Approve the programme of work to be taken forward by the SLB Sub Groups
- Approve/monitor the programme communication strategy
- Advise the Minister in key decisions in relation to the programme.



- Sub Group A Legislative Framework & Capacity Building (includes HR, Performance Management, Governance)
- Sub Group B Service Improvement (includes front office, back office and infrastructure)



- Chaired/Vice Chaired by SLB members
- + 8 Elected members, +3 senior Council officers,
- Work with other sub-groups or task & finish groups
- To develop proposals for prioritised, costed and timetabled programme of work
- Joint secretariat DOE/NILGA



- Sub Groups subject to review
- External consultancy support likely
- To maximise the development of co-operative & collaborative ventures across groups of Councils
- SLB Sub-Group proposals provide detail to support bids for central government funds



SLB Sub-Group A – Legislative Framework & Capacity Building

- Early Modernisation Order proposed
- Likely to be consulted on in Spring 2008
- Followed by legislation on restructuring when way forward is clear



SLB Sub-Group A – Legislative Framework & Capacity Building

- Modernising financial arrangements
- Facility to develop remuneration and severance schemes
- Mandatory codes of conduct and ethical standards
- Updated companies provisions
- Assess potential for inclusion of Power of Wellbeing

Early Modernisation order



SLB Sub-Group A – Legislative Framework & Capacity Building

- Capacity Building to identify priorities, costs/Benefits etc
- Performance management
- Governance
- HR



- Intended to improve way in which Councils work
- To deliver business-related services standardised, simple, VFM
- To enable resources to be released to improve frontline service delivery



SLB Sub-Group B – Service Improvement

- Front-line customer service mechanisms
- Back-office service delivery (HR, finance, procurement, & estates)
- Common ICT infrastructure for local government
