## Tailored and Targeted Support Phase II

- 9 local authorities 2009/10
- Capacity to deliver
- Potential to increase take up
- Willingness to work in partnership with SFT
- Link to Regional Engagement Project
- Target LA's where project can have the biggest impact



# **Supported Learning Groups:**

- Aim: Supported Learning Groups are a way for small groups of local authority participants to come together to:
  - solve problems
  - address real work challenges
  - learn from each other
- Foster a supportive but challenging environment of peer learning and activity within the Group.



#### **Supported Learning Groups**

O Delivery:

- Piloted 4 (Long-Term Funding and FSM)
- Four sessions
- Membership from across the country
- Facilitated by independent Consultant
- Participant focused



## **Long-Term Funding Supported Learning Groups**

- Developing a better understanding of the different funding models operated within other local authorities
- Raising the political profile of the school meals service at local level
- Exploring potential efficiency savings by increasing school meal take-up
- Securing other sources of funding e.g. inequalities and obesity monies
- Identifying the breakdown of school food costs
- Developing a deeper understanding of the challenges faced within their local authority in terms of Long-Term Funding



#### **Long-Term Funding SLG: Evaluation**

- On-going Evaluation
- Detailed post project evaluation
- Generally positive:
  - Valued opportunity to meet together and share issues and learning
  - Opportunity to raise specific issues within a local authority
  - High level of satisfaction for the independent facilitation
- Objectives met
- Feedback regarding clear aims and expectations
- Participant's 'ultimate' expectations



## Long-Term Funding Supported Learning Groups

#### Key Findings:

- Increased take-up of school meals and breaking even
- Forward planning post School Lunch Grant post 2011
- External and internal partnerships
- Raise the profile of school meals
- Engagement and Buy-in school senior leadership teams
- Quantifying long-term benefits of healthy school meals

# Regional engagement:

- Recent DCSF letter to GORs
- SFT meetings with DCLs
  - o set regional trajectory to increase take up
  - o develop high level school lunch take-up plan
  - support LAs in achieving increase in take up
- Letters also sent to Head teachers, Governors, LAs



#### NI 52

- National Indicator 52
  - One of 198 National Indicators for local authorities and local authority partnerships
  - Aims to assess the increase in healthy eating among children and young people by measuring school lunch take up
  - Introduced April 2009
- O PSA12
  - Improve the health and well being of children and young people
- Data collected annually April to March (financial year)
- The standardised methodology will;
  - address some of the inconsistencies in previous data
  - create a more robust and consistent measure of take up across all LAs
  - generate a more comprehensive picture of school catering nationally
