

Waste Protocols Project


- Partnership between WRAP, EA and now NIEA
- Establish end of waste criteria for a number of waste streams.
- To provide more clarity on end of waste, stop materials being landfilled unnecessarily and increase the use of waste as a resource.
- By March 2010, potentially over 20 materials covered by a quality protocol.
