



























# LSB 'pilot status' programme

- Made real differences to local communities



# How do ward councillors link with their neighbourhood management team?



- Existing community engagement mechanisms (e.g. PACTs, LPGs, JAMs etc.) that feed priorities/concerns to NM teams
- Existing member-officer relationships as officers should be engaged with neighbourhood management process
- Cardiff South West model pre-meetings with NM team chair
- New neighbourhood Officers (x6) job description includes ward member liaison role
- Proposed interactive features of Proud Capital LSB website
- Contact NM team chair and ask for issue to be raised



Benefits of 'area committee' or 'area forum' approach for neighbourhood management

- Allow all ward councillors to hold council service areas to account for their engagement/involvement in improving Cardiff's neighbourhoods
- Allow councillors to hold other agencies (e.g. police, fire, health etc.) to account for their engagement/involvement in improving Cardiff's neighbourhoods
