

### Transforming Neighbourhoods Programme Aim:



“To reduce the gap between neighbourhoods as measured by key **economic, social and environmental** indicators and citizen experiences. This is to be achieved via increasing awareness and understanding between LSB partners of their respective roles and activities, leading to more collaborative citizen-focused working; targeted and co-ordinated interventions and the alignment and prioritisation of resources to tackle the greatest needs.”

### 'Neighbourhoods' mapping exercise



Balance needed:

- Teams need to be close enough to 'ground level' to be *relevant* to individual neighbourhoods

But

- Not so many teams that it's impossible to populate them with senior enough managers to affect significant change

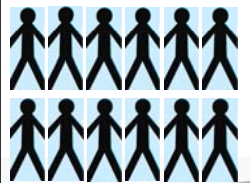

Other locality-based staff (e.g. Communities First, RSLs, voluntary organisations, head teachers, Youth Services, Social Services, Fire Station Commanders, district housing officers, clinics, wardens etc..)



Resources largely already in place but not co-ordinated or joined up

### The Cardiff Neighbourhood Management Model – step 2



If we could join these two boxes up and co-ordinate as 'teams' we would have the basis of multi-agency neighbourhood management...but we'd be no further forward than the English pathfinders

### How do we involve mainstream non geographical services ?

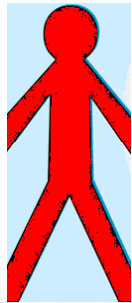


- Cardiff Council has approximately 130 operational managers – very senior managers – who have largely city-wide responsibilities within their particular silos.

E.g. Martin Murphy – Part of HANR, OM for housing management & neighbourhood renewal

**What if, in addition to his 'day job', we gave Martin a geographic responsibility for intelligence-led, problem-oriented neighbourhood management .....**

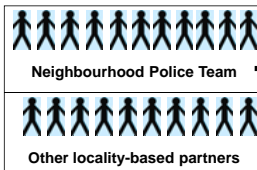


Senior Cardiff Council operational manager with generic/city wide responsibilities (day job)

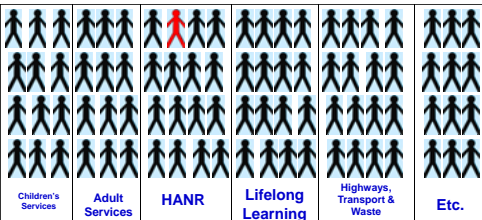
Additional **geographic** responsibility for Ely, Caerau, Canton and Riverside

### The Cardiff Neighbourhood Management Model – step 3



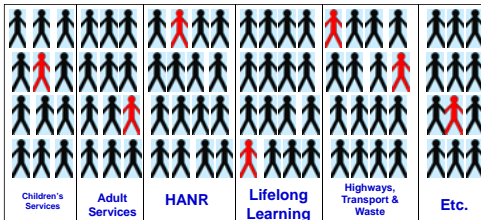
130 OMs divided across 6-12 neighbourhood management teams...

### The Cardiff Neighbourhood Management Model – step 3

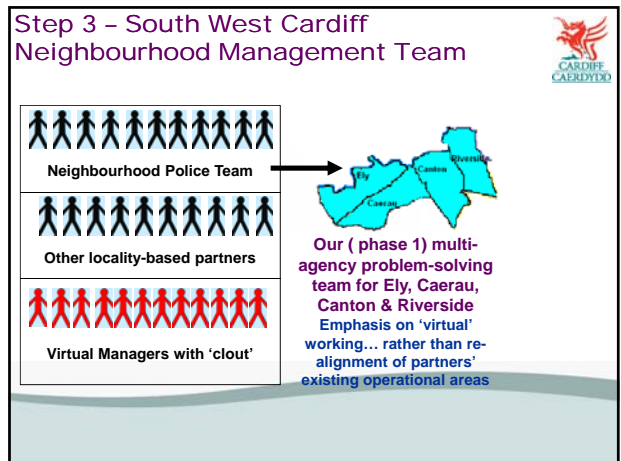
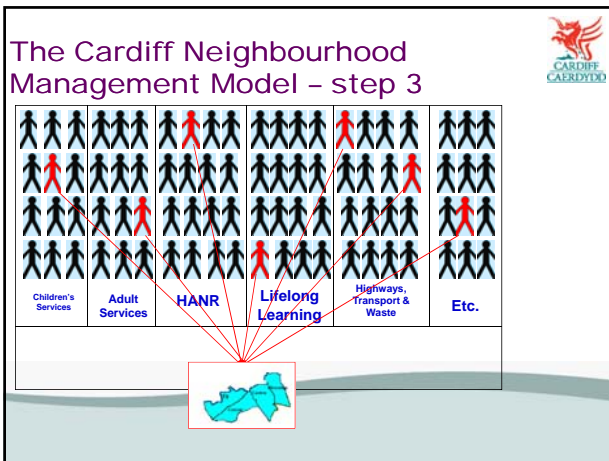


Cardiff Council's Operational Managers (including **Martin**) divided across service area silos

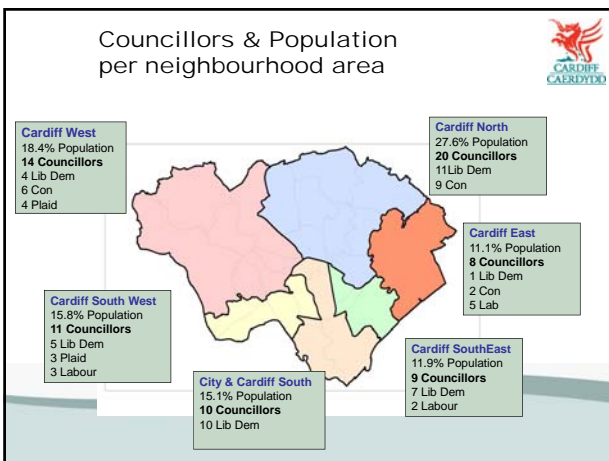
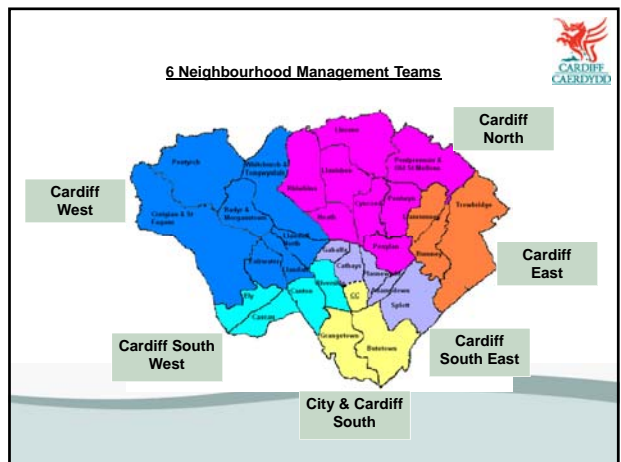
### The Cardiff Neighbourhood Management Model – step 3



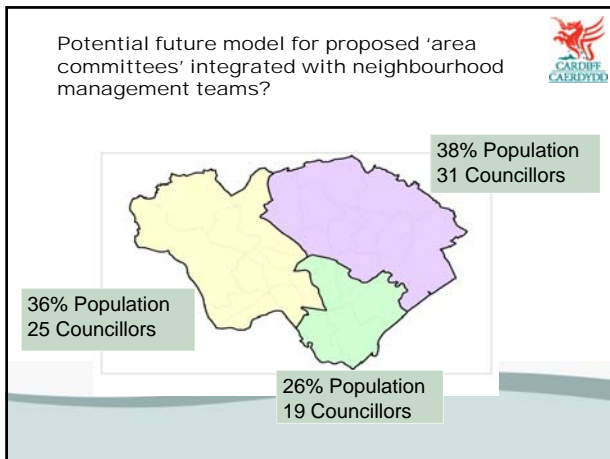
More OMs from different service areas are identified...



- ### LSB 'pilot status' programme
- Brought partners together in locality focused problem-solving teams
  - Resulted in significant programme-bending to Communities First areas
  - Attracted national (WAG, Home Office and DCLG) attention
  - Made real differences to local communities



- ### How do ward councillors link with their neighbourhood management team?
- Existing community engagement mechanisms (e.g. PACTs, LPGs, JAMs etc.) that feed priorities/concerns to NM teams
  - Existing member-officer relationships as officers should be engaged with neighbourhood management process
  - Cardiff South West model – pre-meetings with NM team chair
  - New neighbourhood Officers (x6) – job description includes ward member liaison role
  - Proposed interactive features of Proud Capital LSB website
  - Contact NM team chair and ask for issue to be raised



- Benefits of 'area committee' or 'area forum' approach for neighbourhood management
- Provides a structured and public way to:**
- Allow all ward councillors to hold council service areas to account for their engagement/involvement in improving Cardiff's neighbourhoods
  - Allow councillors to hold other agencies (e.g. police, fire, health etc.) to account for their engagement/involvement in improving Cardiff's neighbourhoods
