Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Bill

....a service delivery perspective

- 'Begin as we mean to go on' set the tone
 - Act on new powers early, start with a 'bang'
- Enforcement arrangements
 - Integration with existing roles and duties
 - Enforcement 'policy'
 - Communication
 - Cross service collaboration (internal and external)
- Resources
 - Budget implications
 - Staffing

Specific issues...

- Consultation on Clean neighbourhoods and Environment Bill closed on 23rd April 2010
- Scope of fly posting offences
- Time frame for complying with Litter Clearing Notice
- Scope of application of Street Litter Control Notices
- Alley gating practical issues
- Enforcement of conditions of Consent to Distribute Printed Material – no penalty, just recouping of costs
- Retention of graffiti removal powers
- Enforcement of Defacement Removal Notices no penalty, just cost recouping
- Existing powers to remove placards or posters compromised by need to give 2 days notice

Scope

- Gating Orders
- Vehicles
- Litter Control
- · Graffiti and fly posting
- Dog control
- Noise Control
- Statutory nuisance powers

Potential Impacts.....

- Offers expedient ways of addressing 'cleaner, greener' neighbourhood issues
- · Covers issues that 'really matter' to communities
- Timely responses facilitated by widespread availability of 'Fixed penalty' powers
- Councils tackling local environmental issues that matter to local people
