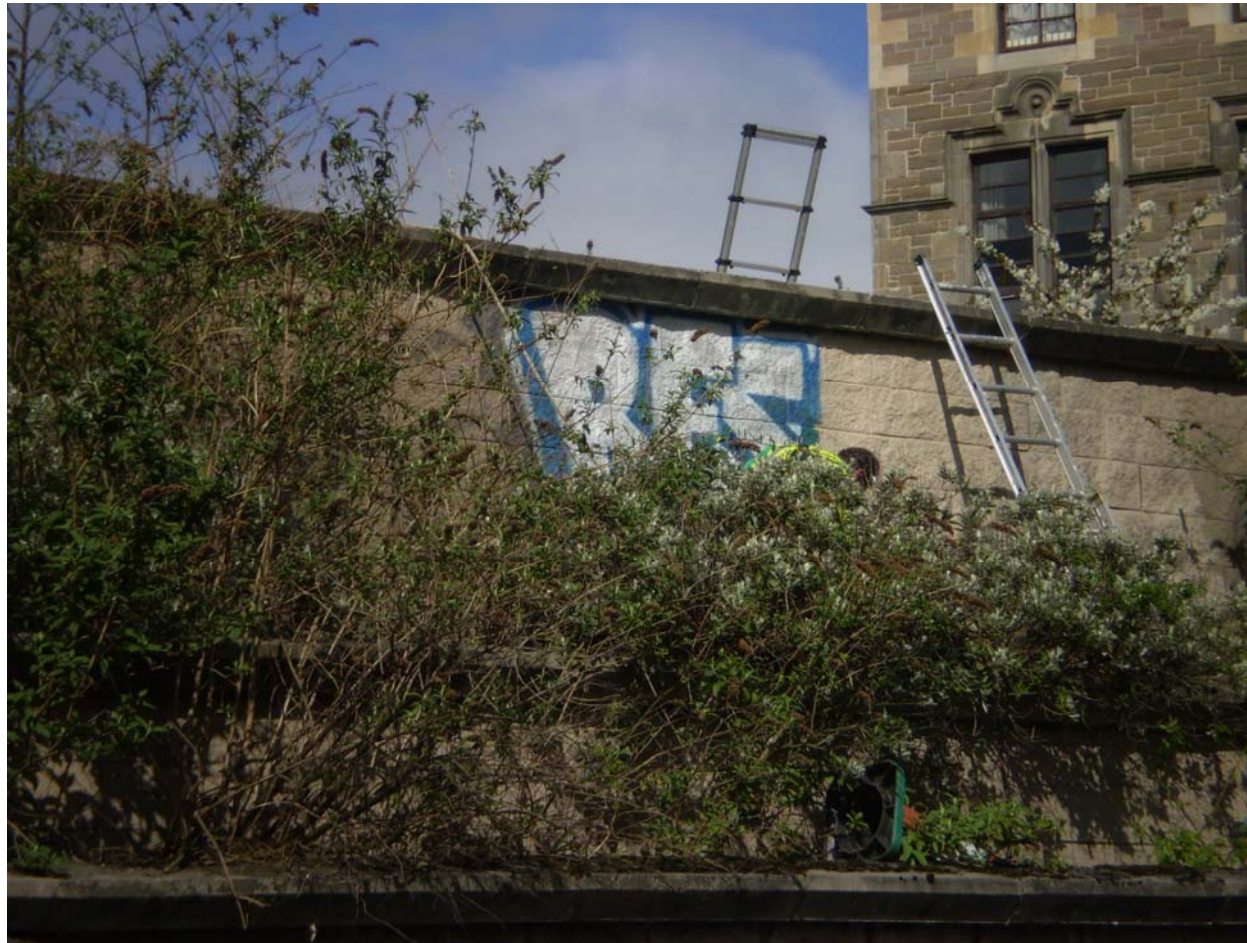
- 3 months June – August '10
