

Scope of Tender






- Electrical Connections

- High Volume and Value




AGMA Procurement Hub – Who Are We?

- Category Management Approach




Hub Governance





Street Lighting Procurement Governance






Procurement Process





- Wigan Council Lead Authority
- Baselining /Options Appraisal
- Commitment to Participate
- EU Open Procedure
- Framework Agreement 2 year with 2 x 1 yr extensions/2 geographical 'Lots'
- Provision of information:
 - Timely
 - Transparent




Outcomes





- First framework agreement for Connections in UK
- High number of tenderers
- Good quality
- Competitive rates
- Savings of c. £2.4m identified
- Framework now 'live' (w.e.f. 12/09/11)
- Feedback to Ofgem


