Road Freight Licensing

The Goods Vehicles (Licensing of Operators) Act (Northern Ireland) 2010



Requirement for an 'O' Licence?

"A licence must be held by the operator of goods vehicles (+3.5 tonnes) used on a public road to carry goods for hire or reward or in connection with a trade or business"



Requirements

- All Operators licensed
- All Operators to satisfy standards of fitness/repute financial standing/professional competence
- Continuous Licensing reviewed every 5 years
- Applications advertised
- Operating Centres included
- Operators required to give Undertakings
- New powers to the Department (to hold Inquiries, exercise discretion and tougher enforcement)



Our Powers

Wide ranging discretionary powers

- > Differentiate between mistakes and intent
 - Mistakes Advice
 - Intent Sanctions Warning
 - Curtailment
 - Suspension
 - Revocations



What we Expect

Everyone to play their part

- Top to Bottom
- Commitment, plans, actions

Who is Responsible?

- Driver at the Roadside
- Licence Holder at the Public Inquiry

Hierarchy of Action

- Driver / Vehicle at the roadside
- Inspections, Maintenance,

Planned, Records, Training,

Procedures

Enforcement Reports, Convictions,

Prohibitions, GV Test Failures.

Enforcement

- Existing Enforcement resources increased
- Roadside penalties
- Vehicles being used without an operators licence (when one is required) can be impounded and disposed of.



On the Road!

- > All vehicles must be roadworthy
- All drivers must comply with traffic and transport Law (undertaking made by operators)
