

Austerity

- £900,000 annual savings required from WCC Waste Management
- Minimal impact on service delivery + user satisfaction
- Track record of working with 3rd Sector on Reuse Schemes – National Best Practice






The Solution

- 6 sites brought in house
- Sub-contracting of 2 sites to Social Enterprise (MOU & Lease)
- Charity Reuse Shops
- SAVING = £6.3m
 over 7 years





WCR Partnership





Lower House Farm HWRC

- Opened 12 June 2013
- Joint provision with Staffordshire County Council
- Near Tamworth (M42/A5)
- Projected WCR charity shop income £100,000
- Proceeds shared with Staffordshire Community Foundation





Impact #1

- Stockton and Wellesbourne achieving recycling rates of 74% and 76% respectively – up around 18% on the former private sector operator.
- 10+ tonnes of material is being diverted from landfill by WCR's reuse shops each month.
- Reuse shops' turnover for 2013/14 should exceed £200,000 while recyclate income will add £50,000.
- Showcased at the 2012 + 2013 National Civic Amenity Sites Conference
- Cited as best practice in recently-published HWRC guidance by WRAP
- Highly-equitable business model spreading the benefit to hundreds of grassroots community groups through a grantmaking community foundation.



Impact #2

- Won 'Best Partnership Award' at the LARAC Celebration Awards 2012 and named 'Community Champion of the Year' at the 2012 CIWM Awards for Environmental Excellence.
- Won 'Best Service Award' at the National Procurement Awards 2013/14.
- Best practice tours of WCR sites have been organised for representatives from 9 English and Welsh authorities.
- 22 volunteers have already been recruited and trained by WCR notching up a total of 4,000 hours of volunteering per annum.
- The initiative is providing more than 6,000 hours of work experience and accredited training to volunteers, paid staff (5 FTE) and 3 apprentices.

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




Trends in Refuse Collection & Street Cleansing






Recycling rates per tonne per household now at **0.43** (slight increase from 2010/11)

Significant improvement in % composted.

New high for % of total waste sent for recycling



Street Cleansing


PI37a- % sites falling below grade b for cleanliness (LeqsPro survey with requisite sample size) = **7.21%** (2011/12)

PI37b- % sites falling below grade b for cleanliness (LeqsPro survey with reduced sample size or other survey method) = **5.49%** (2011/12)


Customer satisfaction has increased year on year and now stands at **71.6%**

Number of litter FPN's showing annual increase from 382 in 2010/11 to 564 in 2011/12.

Number of dog fouling FPN's remain static since 2009/09




Cost analysis breakdown- Streets




- **Reduction** in average **staff costs** and frontline staff costs
- Increase in average CEC's (4.21 in 2005/06; 6.89% in 2011/12 = 64% increase)

Cost analysis breakdown- Refuse



- **Reduction** in average **staff costs** (Public pay freeze? Reduced non contractual overtime?)
- Increase in average transport costs (Fuel price inflation?)
- **Reduction** in average **CEC's** (CEC's disproportionately passed through to frontline services?)

Sickness Absence



Refuse collection: performance continues to oscillate with a slight **increase this year** from a trend low in 2010/11

Street cleansing: slight **increase this year**, breaking trend of year-on-year reduction since 2007/08
